Clearly communicate how user data is collected, used, stored, and protected

Explain users' rights regarding data access, correction, and deletion, and provide contact information for data-related inquiries

Content Guidelines

Use plain, accessible language that avoids legal jargon, making the policy understandable for all

users.

Organize the policy with clear headings and subheadings (e.g., "Data Collection," "Data Use," "User Rights") to help users quickly locate relevant sections.

Include information on how often the policy is updated and the effective date of the current version.

Ensure that any changes are communicated to users in a transparent manner.

Design and Integration

Provide prominent links to the Privacy Policy in the website footer and during any data collection processes (e.g., sign-up forms).
